

**Dear Parents and Carers** 

Welcome back! I hope you all had a lovely summer holiday. It was great to see all the children on Wednesday excited to be back at school and ready to learn!

### **School Uniform**

It is always useful at the beginning of the year to remind everyone again about school uniform. Our colours are **grey** (trousers, skirts, pinafores, shorts), **white** (polo shirts, shirts, blouses) **royal blue** (jumpers or cardigans). Grey or black tights or white socks with skirts, pinafores or dresses. Grey or black socks with trousers or shorts. **Plain black** sensible shoes or trainers (no converse trainers or other trainers with white logos etc please). **Jewellery**: The only jewellery allowed in school is plain stud earrings and a watch. No wrist bands please. **Hair**: All long hair needs to be tied back. All hair should be of **natural colour**. Extreme haircuts, such as mohicans and shaved patterns/images, and dyed hair, are not considered appropriate for school. **Thank you for your support with our school uniform policy.** 

## **Home Learning**

This year we are having a real focus on children **reading more**, both at home and at school. So the children's home learning this year will be based around children reading regularly at home. **It's been proven that children who read for pleasure are more likely to be successful and happy throughout their lives (OECD).** Children who are read to at home or read for pleasure have a wider vocabulary and so their writing improves too! You will be able to find out more about how you can support with reading at home at one of our Curriculum Chats (see important dates for when these are taking place).

To support children with their **maths** knowledge we have bought "Maths is fun!" booklets for all the children which you will be receiving soon. Again, more information about this at our Curriculum Chats. Finally, we have also bought a new subscription for an online resource for practising maths, spelling and reading which children can access at home called **Sumdog** – more information and login details to follow soon.

## Jeans for Genes

Every year we support this national charity fundraising event to raise awareness about children and families living with genetic disorders. Their motto is "Wear jeans change lives". So on **Friday 21**<sup>st</sup> **September** children can wear jeans to school for a donation of £1 – you are obviously welcome to donate more if you wish to. Children will need to wear the rest of their school uniform – the only change is a pair of jeans. This then makes it really clear what the day is about – it is not a non-school uniform day. #### **Behaviour at Meridian**

You might have heard your children come home excited about some changes to the way we manage behaviour at Meridian. We firmly believe behaviour at our school is excellent. Children at Meridian continuously display our school values and this has been confirmed by visitors and members of the public on trips. That doesn't mean we aren't always striving to improve and make it even better. We listened to feedback from parents, children and staff and we have adjusted our behaviour policy to reflect these improvements. We've listed some of the key changes below.

# 3 clear, simple rules



Children come to school to enjoy, achieve and learn. We know that when children are clear in what is expected of them they understand what is right and wrong. Therefore we have 3 rules that we expect of both adults and children at all times. They are: Ready, Respectful, Safe. This way no matter where the children are or who is addressing the child we are all using the consistent message for what outstanding behaviour looks like.

# Recognising 'Above & Beyond' behaviour

What is staying the same?

The school will continue to use coins for rewarding effort and fish for behaviour. Once a class reaches 100 coins they will vote for a coin treat and at the end of each week class fish are counted up and the winner will be announced in assembly and rewarded with a NEW trophy to keep for the week and an extra 10 minutes playtime. Also staying the same will be commendation. We adore sharing with our parent and carer community the achievements of the children during these assemblies and wouldn't change these for the world.





What's even better?

Research suggests you get more of the behaviour you notice the most. So it make sense to focus on those who relentlessly display a positive attitude to learning. Keep your eyes on the post as teachers have a stack of positive postcards ready to send home when children go above and beyond what is expected of them. In addition when teachers feel appropriate they might give a phone call home to let you know just how hard your child has been trying!

# We all make mistakes...

At Meridian we are all 'Learning For Life' which means we can't get it right all the time. However if a child is purposefully attempting to disrupt others and their own learning then it is important we have a clear system in place for sanctioning poor choices. They are;


- 1. Reminder a discreet signal to the child about our 3 rules.
- 2. Caution a clear verbal caution delivered privately that their choices are disrupting learning
- 3. Last Chance speaking to the child giving them one more chance to engage
- 4. Time Out a short period of time spent outside the classroom or away from the playground and a chance to breathe and reflect on why their behaviour is not following our school rules.
- Repair the opportunity to discuss with their teacher why the behaviour was not acceptable and then time given for the child to catch up on any learning missed.

# **Attendance**

Excellent attendance at school is so important so that children do not miss the vital teaching and learning that takes place every day in class and do not fall behind.

Each week we celebrate the class with the best attendance and they earn coins for their treasure chest on the class behaviour board.



Don't forget – if your child is off school you need to send in a written note on the day they return so that we can consider changing the registration code to an authorised absence. <u>Please note a reason of "ill" or "unwell"</u> is not acceptable.

# **Our Attendance Team!**

Our Attendance Team are here to support you if you are worried about your child's attendance.

Miss Danni Maslen – Attendance Lead – Miss Maslen oversees the work of the team and can meet with parents to discuss any letters sent out or offer advice/support

Mrs Rose Sawyerr – Learning Mentor – Mrs Sawyerr may contact you to invite you in for an informal chat if your child's attendance starts to fall below 95%. She can offer support and guidance as well as set targets for improving attendance. In some cases, she may work with children to support them with coming into school

Mrs Claire Erridge – Education Welfare Officer – Mrs Erridge works one day a week and she will contact you to invite you in for a meeting if your child's attendance falls below 92%. You can also make an appointment to see her if you would like any advice or support.

Mrs Jacqui Dray – Attendance and Admissions Officer – Mrs Dray makes the phone calls if your child is absent and we have not heard from you. She updates registration codes once written notes have been received and she can support you with making appointments to speak with Miss Maslen, Mrs Sawyerr and Mrs Erridge. She can also advise about school policy, such as what evidence to bring in to support medical and dental appointments.

If you have any concerns or worries about getting your child into school regularly and on time, please do make an appointment to meet with any of the team and we can look at different ways that we can support you and your child with coming to school. Please come and speak with us sooner rather than later! **We are here to help.** 



# What to do if you have a worry or concern

At the beginning of a new school year it is always useful to remind everyone about what to do if you have concern. In the first instance, please speak with your child's class teacher. You can make an appointment to see them after school, ask for them to call you when they are available or e-mail the office (who will then forward the message on). This is the most useful way to communicate your concerns as the class teacher/s know your child the best and so will be able to answer any questions and support you and your child through any issues you may have.

Next, if you are not satisfied you can make an appointment to speak with the Phase Leader (see below for more information about who they are).

After this stage you are welcome to make an appointment to speak with Ms Westcott. If she is unavailable, then please speak with Mr Doody (Deputy Headteacher). You can also meet with Ms Maslen (Assistant Headteacher) if Mr Doody is unavailable.

Finally, if you still wish to take the matter further you can put your concerns in writing or e-mail to the Chair of Governors (Mrs Janet Anthony) and hand/send it to the school office who will forward this on.

Please come and speak with us. We are here to help.

#### **Parent Coffee Morning**

#### **Learning at Meridian**

Here are some of the different ways you can find out about the learning at Meridian:

# Parents' Evening

We hold Parents' Evening twice a year. At these meetings you will have the opportunity to find out how your child is getting on in school, both academically and socially. You will be able to find out about the progress they are making and how you can help at home. You will also be able to have a look at your children's books.

# **Curriculum Open Afternoons**

We have these three times a year at the end of terms 2, 4 and 6. Parents are invited to come along and celebrate the children's learning at the end of the current learning topic. You can come along for the afternoon and spend time in your children's classrooms and find out what they have learnt, have a look at the work on display and even join in with some fun activities! The children's English and Maths books (Learning Journey books for Reception children) will also be available for you to see (in addition to Parents' Evening). So that means you will have 5 opportunities throughout the year to have a look at the progress your children have made in their books.

# **Curriculum Chats**

At the beginning of terms 1, 3 and 5 you are invited to hear about the upcoming learning opportunities that have been planned for the children in their year groups. These meetings take place in the afternoons just before the end of the school day so that you are then able to collect your children on time! At these meetings the teachers share the topic (or Learning Journey) that the children will be learning about and the different subjects they will be taught. They will also explain P.E. days. If you are unable to attend, the notes from the presentation and topic information will be sent home and this information will be sent home and also uploaded onto the school website. If you have any questions about the planned learning, you are always welcome to contact the class teacher.

#### **Reports**

In response to the Parent Questionnaire, we are currently in the process of updating how we report to parents and the information that we share with you about the progress your children are making in school. We will update you about this very soon.

#### Website

Our website has lots of general information about the learning that takes place at Meridian, including information sheets to support you with helping your child learn at home.
