Ofsted

Since my last newsletter we had an Ofsted inspection on 20th November! As Meridian was judged as good in our last inspection in December 2014, it was a short one-day visit with one inspector. Thank you to all the parents/carers who took the time to complete the Parent View and to all the children that completed the online questionnaire. It was an intense day as the inspector spent time with me and Mr Doody, showing him around the school and demonstrating the great work that the teachers and teaching assistants do at Meridian. He also spent time with members of the leadership team, met with governors and spoke with parents. As well as speaking to different adults he spoke to the children too, in a meeting, in classrooms and out on the playground. As always, they were fantastic and they were all keen to speak to the inspector and tell him everything they loved about Meridian – the children were clearly proud of their school and I was incredibly proud of them. The final report will be written in a letter which will be shared with parents/carers as soon as it is released in the next couple of weeks.

Please can I remind parents that children should not be left unattended at the school gates in the morning. We cannot guarantee their safety outside of the school grounds. We open the gates and doors at the same time to minimise queues and waiting. So please can I remind parents that children walking on their own to school should not be arriving at school before 8.35am. Thank you for helping us keep your children safe.






Attendance

When children are ill . . .

As a school we completely understand that there are times when children are ill and they need to stay off school. We appreciate that sometimes this is a hard decision to make and as a school we can support you with this. Some parents ask us to try and see if their child is well enough to be in school and call them if they start to feel unwell – we are always happy to do this. There are some illnesses which are contagious, such as chickenpox and impetigo, when children clearly need to be off school. There are some illnesses which can spread if not carefully managed, such as sickness and diarrhoea (see advice later on in this newsletter.) There are times when you need to take your child straight to the doctor, such if there is an unusual rash or your child's has had a high temperature for a couple of days. If you are not sure whether to keep your child off school, you are very welcome to come in and discuss this with us or refer to the chart below for some simple advice.



- Send me to school if . . .
- I have a runny nose or just a cough, but no other symptoms
- I haven't taken any feverreducing medicine for 24 hours and I haven't had a fever during that time



- Keep me at home if .
- I have a temperature higher than 100 degrees even after taking medicine
- I am throwing up or have diarrhoea
- My eyes are pink and crusty



- Call the doctor if . .
- I have a temperature higher than 100 degrees for more than two days
- I've been throwing up or have diarrhoea for more than two days
- I've had sniffles for more than a week and they aren't getting better
- I still have asthma symptoms after using my asthma medicine (call 999 if I'm having trouble breathing after using an inhaler)

If your child is absent from school regularly with illness, Mrs Erridge may be in contact to see how we can support you and your child and you may be asked for medical evidence to authorise further illnesses. As a school we are also able to make referrals to the school nursing service for advice and support in case there are underlying health issues that are causing regular bouts of illness.

You know your children best, but we are happy to help if we can.

Carpet squares

Guttering

Hoses

Brief cases

Buggies, push chairs




Sickness and Diarrhoea

If your child has sickness or diarrhoea that has been brought on by **other reasons** and you feel that they are well enough to come to school and **not infectious**, you are welcome to send them in.
