# **LEARNING AT MERIDIAN**

### **Curriculum Topics for the Spring Term**

The teachers have been busy over the last couple of weeks planning for the Spring Terms. Our curriculum theme for terms 3 and 4 is "Environmental Issues and Citizenship".

Nursery and Reception will be learning about how to look after animals and plants





Year 1 and Year 2 will be learning about why our woodlands are so important for wildlife and plants





Year 3 and Year 4 will be learning about why the Amazon Rainforest needs to be protected



Year 5 and Year 6 will be learning about climate change, looking particularly at protecting polar regions of the world

# PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT AT MERIDIAN

#### **PSHE Lessons**

As part of our Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE) lessons this term, the children have been learning about **celebrating difference**.

This includes learning about:

- making friends and families in Nursery and Reception;
- similarities and differences in each other and challenging negative stereotypes in Year 1 and Year 2;
- giving and receiving compliments and judging by appearance in Year 3 and Year
   4;
- rumours and name-calling, and inclusion/exclusion in Year 5 and Year 6.

All children have learnt about bullying in an age appropriate way and how to respond to this should it happen to them.

In our recent Pupil Voice session, all children were allocated to different subjects to meet with subject leaders so we could hear about what they have been learning in different subjects. Here is what some children said about PSHE:

"The lessons on peer pressure have really helped me" - Year 5
"You must always tell a grown up if someone is being unkind to you" - Year 2

"I like listening to the chime bar and doing the breathing" - Year 1
