HEADTEACHER UPDATE

Dear Parents and Carers

I hope you are all well and had a good half-term break. We have started back to term 4 really positively – it was lovely to see everyone back and ready for school!

New Policies

The Leadership Team and Governors have worked together to produce two new policies to support the school in managing communications between staff and parents/carers and also setting out expectations for parents'/carers' behaviour and conduct in school.

We are really lucky at Meridian that the vast majority of parents and carers are incredibly supportive of the school and our team – thank you.

However, in recent months there have been increasing incidents of parents/carers having unrealistic and unreasonable expectations of what a school can offer to support their child; aggressive and persistent email expectations being placed on teachers and the leadership team; aggressive and intimidating behaviour towards staff.

We are always here to support you and your children within the parameters of what a primary school can offer. However, we are not able to support unreasonable requests or tolerate unacceptable behaviour at Meridian.

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT AT MERIDIAN

PSHE lessons this term

In term 4 our PSHE lessons are focused on the theme "Healthy Me".

Children will be learning about how to keep themselves physically and mentally healthy.

Our younger children in EYFS will be learning eating healthy foods, keeping clean and the importance of physical activity.

In Years 1 and 2 they will be learning about making healthy choices, keeping safe (including road safety and medicines)

Years 3 and 4 will be learning about healthy and safe choices, including fitness, online safety, attitudes towards drugs in Year 3 and smoking/alcohol in Year 4

Years 5 and 6 will be learning about relationships with food, taking personal responsibility and emotional and mental health.
