Learning about life in the past

The children in KS2 are really enjoying learning about life in the 20th Century. Year 3 are learning about 1950s, Year 4 are learning about 1960s, Year 6 are learning about 1970s and Year 5 are learning about 1980s. It was great to see so many of them dressed up to represent their decade last Friday – the costumes and outfits they were wearing were amazing! Thank you so much for supporting us with this – the children loved it. As part of this day, Year 3 learnt some different dances from the 1950s taught to them by one of the parents and Year 5 have been perfecting their version of Michael Jackson's Thriller dance – fantastic learning opportunities for everyone. Miss Mile's parents and my mum also visited Year 3 to talk about life in the 1950s and the children had thought of some really interesting questions to ask them. Some of staff have even been brave enough to share some photographs of themselves if they were around in these decades – which then made some of us feel very old! Thank you to everyone that took part.

Swimming lessons

You may be aware that at Meridian the children in Years 3 and 4 go swimming. In order to ensure our children have these swimming lessons we have to rely on the support of the parents to drop children off at the pool in the morning and contribute towards the cost of the lessons. The school also supports parents by subsidising the cost of these lessons and paying for the transport back to school. I went to watch the swimming lessons this week and I have to say that the lessons I observed were excellent and the children absolutely loved it! It was wonderful to see the children learning different swimming skills and techniques and being physically active for an hour. I am sure that you will agree that as we live so close to the sea, it is vitally important for the children to learn to swim and so I would like to thank all the parents for their support for these lessons – both in terms of helping the school be able to afford to offer these (especially in these difficult times of school budget cuts) and by making arrangements to drop off at the pool in the morning. We couldn't do it without you! A huge thank you as well to Mrs Skippings who gives up her own time to be at the pool early to support parents and who joins in to teach the children to swim.

I look forward to seeing you all at parents' evenings next week where you can find out about how your children are progressing with their learning.

Keeping your child safe

We are getting an increasing number of children in Year 5 and Year 6 who are getting angry and upset in school about comments made to them or about them when they are not in school via text messages and/or Social Media. **Did you know that most social media sites (Facebook, Twitter, Snapchat, Instagram, Pinterest, Musical.ly) state that the minimum age is 13 years old and for Youtube the minimum age for your own account is 18 years old?** So our children at Meridian should not be accessing these. *Did you know that Instagram have stated that 55% of reviewers reported seeing content that might be unsuitable for children aged 8 – 12 years old, including risk of seeing sexual content, violence/hatred and bullying?*

If you are allowing your child to use any social media app or online resource then you need to monitor them closely to ensure they are using them appropriately, especially if they have their own mobile phone.

Over the next few months we will be supporting children to understand about how to keep safe online and how to deal with cyberbullying.

Our new cook Ed has been working really hard with her team to improve the quality and range of school lunches at Meridian and I have say that they look (and taste!) delicious. This week the children had the chance to have a Chinese meal to celebrate Chinese New Year and they all really enjoyed it. The catering team had even decorated the serving area with Chinese dragons, lanterns and Happy New Year signs! More special menu days will be added to encourage more children to try something new. Learning about healthy eating is such an important part of children's education and our healthy meals are a great way to support children's understanding of making healthy choices. In addition to the vegetables included in the hot meal selection, there is also a salad bar for additional healthy choices and a fruit option for dessert. So do encourage your children to try one of our school lunches, especially if they are in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 because they are free!
