Parent Council Meeting

We had a really positive Parent Council Meeting this week, with 2 new members joining us: Laura Brown (who has children in Year 5 and Year 6) and Louella Murray (who has children in Year 1 and Year 3). At the meeting we discussed different issues that parents have raised, including congestion at the end of the day by the Reception outdoor area and inconsiderate parking around the school. Healthy Snacks in school (Reception to Year 6)

One of our responsibilities as a school is to support children in making healthy choices. We are planning a healthy living week in July for children to learn, amongst other things, about healthy eating and keeping active. As part of this, we will be revisiting our policies that are linked to children's health and one of the changes we are planning to make is that from September 2017, children will no longer be able to bring in cereal bars for a snack at break time. Research has shown that most cereal bars have a high content of sugar and obviously this not a healthy choice. So from September, children may bring in either a portion of fruit (fresh or dried) or vegetables. We discussed this at our Parent Council meeting and everyone agreed that this was a great way forward to support the children in making health choices. We currently provide free fruit/vegetables for Reception snack table and children in Years 1 and 2 are also able to take a piece of free fruit/vegetables at break time. So if you would like to start supporting us in this transition away from cereal bars, you are welcome to start sending your children in with fruit/vegetable choices in the summer terms.

I hope you have a lovely Easter break and I look forward to seeing the children back on Tuesday 18th April.



School Uniform

If you have any queries or questions about the school, then please do come and ask. The leadership team are available before and after school – please come and ask! Teachers are also available on the playground after school. We have an open door policy and would rather you spoke with us than air your views on Facebook or listen to rumours.

Please remember if you air your views on Facebook or other social media they are no longer private and often these comments can be read by people other than your friends. If negative comments about the school or members of staff are seen and shared with the school you will be asked to take these posts down and if they are abusive or threatening the school will report these to Facebook.

ParentPay

At the moment, parents can use the ParentPay system for making payments for school meals. After half-term we will be introducing this more widely across the school so that parents/carers will be able to pay for trips and uniform online as well. The system will be live at school from 18th April 2017, and from this date we will be working towards no longer accepting cash and cheque payments, making the school a cash-free environment.

ParentPay offers you the freedom to make payments whenever and wherever you like, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and you can do this using a debit or credit card, or in cash through PayPoint stores. We will still be accepting cash and cheque payments in school, for a period of time, and these payments will also be recorded in your ParentPay online account, which will give you a record of all payments you have made to the school regardless of which method you use.

For all KS1 and Nursery pupils without a ParentPay account, we will send you an activation letter containing your activation username and password to setup your ParentPay account. During the activation process you will be guided through changing your username and password to something more memorable; if you have more than one child at a ParentPay school/s you can also add children to a single account providing one login for all children at ParentPay schools.

We hope you will support us in achieving our goal to become a cashless school – your support in using ParentPay will help the school enormously!

"The Governing Body is coming to the end of our second term as a fully constituted board and we have been working hard to both support and challenge the school leadership team.
