# Keeping our children safe

I am sure you will all agree that keeping our children safe at Meridian is incredibly important.

I would like to remind parents that if you wish to speak with a member of the Leadership Team and they are not around outside, you **MUST NOT** walk through the school building to come to the Office. You need to access the school office via the main school entrance

In order to keep the children safe at all times, we have to know exactly which adults are in the building. All adults (including staff members) have to sign in at the office.

It is **NOT APPROPRIATE** to walk into school demanding to meet with someone – it is not keeping our children safe.

From next term onwards we will expect parents of children Year 1 upwards to drop children off at the door and not come into the school building. There will be adults on the door to support children and help them if needed.

For Reception children we would encourage you to do the same, unless your child is still struggling to settle in. Please speak with a member of the Reception Team if you need any advice about this.


For Nursery children, we continue to support parents in settling children in but expect all parents to leave via the gated entrance/exit
