Forest School


Our Forest School experience for the children continues to be a real success and Mr Legate has been working incredibly hard to ensure that the children are enjoying their outside learning. Over the past two weeks, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 have been making leaf crowns. leaf prints and doing bark rubbings, as well as making Fairy homes! They have also been going on journeys around the Forest School area looking for interesting items to talk about. For Years 3 and 4, children have been getting to know the site by imitating animal behaviours when hiding from predators or being the predator themselves! We have now got a shelter for the children to go under if it is really wet.

Now that winter is really approaching it is getting very wet and cold. It is really important that the children have suitable footwear - e.g. wellies/trainers school shoes do not have the grip needed when outside in the Forest School area. They will also need a suitable coat to keep them warm and dry when they go outside.

If you want to send your child in with old clothes to change into, here are some suggestions: Warm Hat Gloves Scarf Old trousers (Tracksuit bottoms) Long sleeve top Warm jumper (Not school jumper) All in one waterproof Waterproof trousers.

The children will be going outside in all weather so it is important that they have the right footwear and clothes to keep them warm and dry!
