#### **Coats in School**

As the weather continues to be cold, please can you ensure that your children have a suitable coat in school. We have some children coming into school in cardigans or hoodies which are not warm enough for when they are outside on the playground for an hour at lunchtime. We want to help ensure that your children don't get ill, so please help us by ensuring they have warm enough coats for outside.

#### **Attendance**

Well done to everyone that managed to brave the cold and snowy weather this week to come into school – thank you!

As you know, improving attendance at Meridian is one of our school priorities this year. **Our target is 96% attendance** by July 2018, which is in line with the national average. Our current attendance figures are **93.8%**, which means we are still a long way off from our target. Our Education Welfare Officer, Mrs Erridge, is continuing to meet with parents to discuss attendance concerns and letters will continue to be sent out to parents about attendance too.

Please don't forget to send in a letter when your child returns to school following an absence from school otherwise the absence will be recorded as unauthorised. For extended periods of unauthorised absence where no explanations from parents are given may lead to a Penalty Notice or legal action being taken against parents. A Penalty Notice is a fine imposed where a parent fails to ensure that their child is in education or has an unacceptable period of unauthorised absences — this is not just for unauthorised holidays, this is for any unauthorised absences

Well done to Year 3 for the highest attendance so far this year!

Following some comments from parents, if the school sends your child home due to illness, then the session will be authorised. However, if your child is then off the next day, normal procedures apply.

#### Absence from school

If your child is off school, please can you remember to call the office and leave a message on the absence line. If we don't hear from you and your child is absent, then the office team call you to find out where your child is. If you do not answer, the office team will then work down the emergency contact list until they can speak to someone in person about your child's absence. If we cannot get hold of anyone we will contact the police and/or do a home visit. So please help us know where your child is and call the office.

Also, don't forget that once your child returns to school, you will need to send in a written note to confirm the reason for your child's absence.

Michael Follett, OPAL director, visited Meridian last week to see how our Outdoor Play and Learning is coming along. He was really impressed with our lunchtime play activities and how much the children are enjoying playing together on the playgrounds and field.

Mr Legate, our Forest School teacher, is now leading on this area of school development and, just like in our Forest School area, he has got big plans!

The next main stage in our development is to create a really huge storage shed so that we can start to build up the resources that the children can access during lunchtimes.

Mr Legate is currently drawing up plans to develop the outside areas so that we can start to plan ahead for these too.

In the summer term we are hoping to organise opportunities for parents to learn more about how we are developing play at Meridian.

Research shows that play contributes to children's physical and emotional health and wellbeing and we are so pleased to be developing this practice at Meridian.
