
## **Around the World**

## Withdrawing your child from learning

As you may be aware, it is a government policy that headteachers cannot grant any time out of school to pupils during term time without "exception circumstances". There are no government guidelines about what exceptional circumstances are and so any decisions made are based on the information provided by parents on the Withdrawal from Learning application. So it is really important that if you feel there are exceptional circumstances for your request, that you provide all the relevant details on your application to help me make an informed decision.

Whilst it is the headteacher's discretion as to whether to authorise or unauthorise a withdrawal from learning request and whether or not a penalty notice is issued, this discretion is limited by an expectation not to authorise any absence during term time, which often results in penalty notices, particularly if the absence is 5 days or more. As stated on the East Sussex County Council application form: "The vast majority of headteachers do not authorise any absence in term time, in fact, many schools refused 100% of requests last year."

At Meridian, every application is considered on a case by case basis using the information provided by parents/carers but, as stated above, headteachers very rarely authorise any absence during term time. On the application form you are asked to sign to say that you understand "... that if the request is unauthorised the Education Support, Behaviour and Attendance Service will be notified of the absence taken and a legal intervention may be instigated in the form of a Penalty Notice or Simple Caution. If a Penalty Notice is issued it will be to each parent for each child taken out of school and that is a fine of £60 which increases to £120 if not paid within the first 21 days. I understand that if I do not pay this will result in legal action". Please note that East Sussex County Council issue the fines and the school does not receive the money.

I hope this helps everyone to understand the process and expectations about absence during term time.
