Mrs Erridge, Miss Maslen, Mrs Sawyerr, Mrs Dray


Our Attendance Team are here to support you if you are worried about your child's attendance.

**Miss Danni Maslen – Attendance Lead** – Miss Maslen oversees the work of the team and can meet with parents to discuss any letters sent out or offer advice/support

Mrs Rose Sawyerr – Learning Mentor – Mrs Sawyerr may contact you to invite you in for an informal chat if your child's attendance starts to fall below 95%. She can offer support and guidance as well as set targets for improving attendance. In some cases, she may work with children to support them with coming into school

**Mrs Claire Erridge – Education Welfare Officer** – Mrs Erridge works one day a week and she will contact you to invite you in for a meeting if your child's attendance falls below 92%. You can also make an appointment to see her if you would like any advice or support.

**Mrs Jacqui Dray – Attendance and Admissions Officer** – Mrs Dray makes the phone calls if your child is absent and we have not heard from you. She updates registration codes once written notes have been received and she can support you with making appointments to speak with Miss Maslen, Mrs Sawyerr and Mrs Erridge. She can also advise about school policy, such as what evidence to bring in to support medical and dental appointments.

## **Meridian Community Primary School and Nursery Attendance Policy**

Following attendance letters being sent out last week to parents where their child's overall attendance this year was below 95%, we have had feedback that some parents did not know about changes to our Attendance Policy that were introduced in September. This information was shared at the beginning of the year and regular reminders are put in our newsletters. However, in light of this feedback, here are two extracts taken from our Attendance Policy:

For Parents/Carers

- To be fully supportive of the School with regard to attendance and punctuality
- To ensure their child attends every day, on time and is prepared for the day
- To support the School and their child (ren) by not requesting authorised absence for holidays during term time and minimising where possible dental appointments and medical appointments during the school day and term time.
- To follow the School procedures for dealing with attendance through making contact with the School/School on the first day of absence and ensuring that they send a signed letter to the School/School when their child returns.
- To contact the School immediately if they have concerns or if there are issues preventing full time attendance
- To sign and adhere to the Home School Agreement with regard to attendance & punctuality

Where there is a significant pattern of absence the school will:

- Start intervention at 95% letter being sent home to parents/carers informing of the cause for concern and the negative impact on their child(ren) learning
- After 3 separate periods of absence the school will contact the parent/carer to discuss reasons why and may invite them to the school for a meeting
- If no contact is made a letter will be sent to the parents advising them that any future absences will require them to produce medical evidence and failure to do so will result in the absences been unauthorised
- If attendance continues to be a concern a referral will be made to the Education Welfare Officer who will offer support and guidance, but may also refer to the LA to issue a Penalty Notice or consideration of legal proceedings

## End of year reports

Later on in the term you will receive your child's end of year report. Included in this report will be a copy of your child's registration certificate for the year. Please look through this carefully and if you see an unauthorised absence (an 'O' code) for any illness your child had this year, please do come in and speak with Jacqui Dray in the school office who can advise you as to whether sending in written confirmation would allow this code to be changed to an 'I' code (authorised illness)

If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact a member of the attendance team.

### News from the Governing Body

Springtime for Governors requires a focus on the finances of the school and we have received the end of financial year accounts and agreed a budget for the year ahead. These are difficult times for Local Authorities and schools who are working within financial constraints. Therefore, we spend a lot of time asking questions, scrutinising figures and ensuring the best value for money for spending at Meridian.

We are delighted to have received and celebrated a highly positive report from our external school advisor – showing that the children at Meridian are receiving a good quality of education in a dynamic and forward-thinking school. The report on the Nursery shows excellent provision for our youngest in the school which is why, I am sure, this is proving a popular choice of provision by local parents.

I have responsibility for Safeguarding in the school and this requires me to audit and monitor the work of all staff in the school relating to keeping children safe. I can report that there are no concerns regarding this area of Governor monitoring.

I really enjoyed coming into school recently to meet with Mr Legate to hear about all of the great work in Forest School and OPAL (Outdoor play and learning). I am delighted that Meridian is prioritising the importance of these areas in the school wider curriculum.

Nationally there are a shortage of school Governors and Meridian is no exception to this. Do let us know if you can think of anyone that would like to fulfil an all-important role of support and challenge at the school. Just ask if you have any questions but rest assured it has its rewards and I would not still be a Governor if this was not the case – in various schools I have been a Governor for over 25 years.

Finally, our clerk, Barbara, is in the process of updating our Governor page on the web site so do go and have a look and see how it is progressing.
