Emerging into sight was a huge helicopter, not flying over or away but hovering just out of full view.

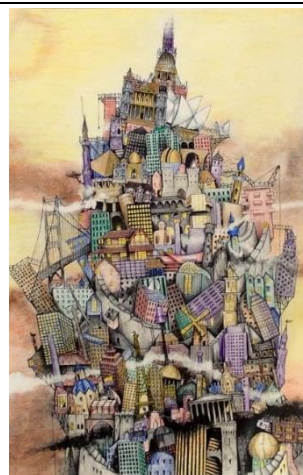
'What's going on, I wonder?' shouted Seb to be heard over the continuing noise.

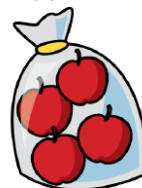
- 1** David gets £30 each week from his parents.
