It's the final music newsletter of the year - so it's... 'DESERT ISLAND DISCS' time!

I can't believe it's our final 'Meridian Music of the Week' newsletter for this year! Our 30th edition – and a **special one** to finish off the year.

Have you ever heard of the radio programme 'Desert Island Discs'? It's a show on Radio 4 and it's been on the radio, on and off, for 78 years! What happens is, every week a famous person is invited on to the programme to talk about their life. But, most importantly, they're asked to imagine they will be shipwrecked on a desert island. They have to think of eight records (discs) or pieces of music that they would take with

them to their imaginary desert island. So, they have to choose their favourite eight pieces of music. They then play short sections of these choices on the radio programme.

Some people choose all classical music, some choose all pop/rock/soul music, and some choose a combination of both.

As well as the eight pieces of music, they're also allowed to 'take' one book and one 'luxury item' to have on their imaginary desert island.

Now, **YOU** can try the same thing!



We've listened to LOADS of different music in our newsletters this last year. From Beethoven to Bach, from Prokofiev to Puccini, from Vivaldi to Vaughan-Williams. But which have been **YOUR** favourites?

Obviously, I don't expect you to remember **all** of the music we've listened to this year, so we'll make things a little easier. On the next page are links to some of **my** favourites from this year.
