
ATTENDANCE AT MERIDIAN

If you are worried about your child's attendance or would like some support with this, please do make an appointment with one of our Pastoral Team, Mrs. Kirton or Mrs. Harmer.


Whole School Attendance 94.3% (our target is 96%)
